Action	Impact
Following the significant impact a professional Sports Coach had over the last academic year on improving PE & Sports provision, and in raising pupil participation in sporting activities, this arrangement will be continued for this academic year.	PE teaching has continued to improve and develop skills needed to participate in a range of sports. Limitations in facilities at school has had an impact on the range of sports taught therefore we need to investigate further opportunities to improve the offer to children. Smaller group size would be of benefit as would off-site activities. Pupil conferencing found positive attitudes to PE in KS1 and KS2.
Our school PE champion will ensure that we enter local inter school competitions and will work with our cluster of schools to promote this. Funding will be available to provide transport to events where necessary.	Children took part in football, cricket and tag-rugby events. We need to improve the ability to work as a team and awareness of others to improve competitive spirit and motivation. Governor visit found a wider range of opportunities being offered with other schools and after school.
Equipment required for the enhancement of sports teaching and to promote physical development will be purchased.	Cycle equipment for EYFS was purchased and enabled children to have planned sessions to promote physical development. Further investment is needed.
