Behave well in and out of class and follow our Values as a way of positive behaviour strategies. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Encourage my child to behave well and demonstrate the school values. Support the school in maintaining good behaviour and discipline. Work with the school to find solutions if behaviour is unacceptable, supporting the school if sanctions are necessary, refer to the schools behaviour policy where necessary. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provide a safe, well-ordered and caring environment. Contact the parents as soon as possible if we have concerns about their child's behaviour. Promote a code of conduct that encourages good behaviour through praise and reward in line with our school values. Inform parents of their child's successes and work together to find solutions if there are concerns.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be honest; Be polite and helpful to everyone; Pass all letters to parents on the day they are issued. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Let the school know if there are any problems that may affect my child's ability to learn. Raise concerns about my child directly and promptly with the school. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Be open and welcoming. Make sure that we listen to all concerns and provide prompt responses and support. Offer a range of opportunities for parents to meet teachers to discuss their child's progress and other, more general, curricular issues. Keep parents informed about the life of the school and any events involving their children. Keep parents informed about what governors do.

Listen to my child repeat their times tables. Set and mark homework as required.
