

Dear Parents & Carers,

Today our Year 6 children got to go for their Year 6 treat day and once again they chose to go to the Cotswold Water Park for the day to go on the 'AquaVenture' inflatable with Mr Tylour and some of the Year 6 parents. It is a special day for them as they prepare for their transition to secondary school by spending some relaxation and fun time with their friends who will soon be going to different schools (and who they won't be seeing every day.) We do this every year and as a group the year six children are able to make some collective choices about what they'd like to do together.

Over the past few weeks and months Sheepscombe School has had many enquiries for school places and of course it is always a pleasure to show people around. Our children are so polite and welcoming and it is one of the things that people love about our school. We therefore have a lengthy waiting list for the first time in a long time and we're just sorry we can't accommodate everyone who wants to come. This week we've completed two 'moving up' mornings so our new Reception children have been in school. Other year groups also moved up for the morning and both Mr Tylour and I were really impressed with how well the children responded to this.

Last week you will remember that I met with Tim Brown, the Director of Education for Gloucestershire. He was similarly impressed with our school and is keen to work with us to evaluate what is special about our school and what other schools can learn from us. We've also had a couple of lovely thank you emails, cards and gifts from some of our pupil's grandparents recently, telling us why their grandchildren love the school, which we showed to Mr Brown. At the beginning of July we also have a visit scheduled from David Drew MP who is keen to visit all the Stroud Schools and he would also love to speak with the children at Celebration Assembly.

Thank you to those children and parents who braved the rain on Tuesday this week to join in with the District Sports field events at St Matthews School. The next athletics event is on Tuesday next week at Stratford Court at 6.00pm, as per my letter last week. Some children have mentioned that they would like to do this but are not on my list as being available for selection - please let me know if they would like to come and I'll do my best to get everyone in who wants to compete.

Also coming home today are letters relating to costumes for the School Play and costumes for the Dance Festival. Merlin class have already had a sewing request from Ms Murphy - if you have any difficulties with this please let us know and we'll try to help!

We have been given the opportunity for any interested children and parents to attend an event run by Stroud Angling Club who run 'taster' angling days for children. They have an event planned for Saturday 6th July 10.00 a.m. at Stoutshill lake Uley near Dursley. They provide all the equipment and bait along with tuition and a basic understanding of fish and watercraft along with learning about invertebrate life that is part of the fish diet. I've wanted to work with Ben O'Sullivan and his team for a couple of years and I'm really thrilled we are able to do this. I know the children will love it.
